This traditional possession, honoring the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, will involve **the carrying of the Blessed Sacrament around the church and adjoining park (weather permitting) and then concluding with the blessing with the Blessed Sacrament called 'Benediction'**.

The Boys and Girls **who have recently received their first Holy Communion are invited to walk at the front, a place of honor in the procession.**

The Corpus Christi Possession has a rich history in the Church going back centuries.

Pope Francis says: "Let us rediscover Eucharistic adoration, which continues the work of the Mass within us," he said. "This will do us much good, for it heals us within. Especially now, when our need is so great."

Pope Benedict XVI spoke eloquently of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi and procession, calling it a "profession of faith by Catholics of Jesus Christ truly alive and present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist, and a public statement of belief."

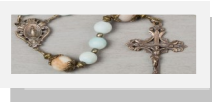
Adoration takes place every Thursday morning after 10am Mass in the Church. All are welcome.

All Ireland Rosary Rally - Knock - Saturday, June 1st

Join thousands of people from around Ireland and beyond for the All Ireland Rosary Rally on June 1st. The day begins at 9.30am with a Conference in St. John's Centre. Speakers include Fr Brendan Kilcoyne, Fr Joseph Mary Deane CFR, and Sr Ana Margarita Lanzas SCTJM. Then there is a chance to meet over 20 apostolates from around Ireland in St John Centre from 1130am. The keynote speaker, Mother Adela Galindo, is coming from Miami, Florida, and she will speak in the Basilica at 1pm. The Stations of the Cross will be outside from 2pm, followed by the Rosary procession. Mass will commence at 3pm in the Basilica and will include the anointing of the sick. Bishop Phonsie Cullinan will be the Main Celebrant. Dana will join the choir to sing. There will also be rosary and scapular making workshops in the marquee. Come Holy Spirit

Pentecost is the great feast marking the birthday of the Church, the moment when the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles and empowered them to start spreading the Good News they had received from Jesus to the world.

That first Christian Pentecost, dramatically described in Acts 2:1-11, was not a once-off event but rather a dam-burst in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit that would never cease. Our 'little Pentecost' might be lower key - or maybe not! In the gospel, John 20:19-22, the risen Jesus simply says to his frightened disciples, "Receive the Holy Spirit". It can be as simple and as profoundly wonderful as that. But the encounter, however it is experienced, changes everything. We too are called and empowered to share our faith with others. If the Spirit helped the earliest Christians to overcome their fears and do amazing things for God, then that same Spirit can help us in whatever unique way that we are called to serve. This Pentecost could be a time of renewal and reflection on the ongoing presence and power of the Holy Spirit in our lives. We might also celebrate the great unity in diversity of cultures and languages within our Church, as Pentecost marks the moment when the Apostles began speaking in different tongues. The true Spirit is not one of division but of togetherness, community, so that we may all be one. Pentecost powerfully reminds us that nothing is impossible for God. "Come Holy Spirit".
