Holy Water has been blessed by a priest and is called a sacramental as it is a visible sign that imparts invisible grace. It is extremely effective at protecting us from evil and temptation. Sprinkle yourself with it before leaving home in the morning and before you go to sleep.

OUR COMMON DESTINY!

The Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, celebrated every year on 15th August, is particularly significant to a parish that bears that title. Mary's assumption was commonly believed since earliest times but was only declared as dogma by Pope Pius XII in 1950:

The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory. Most theologians believe Mary was assumed (taken) at the moment of her death because this more closely associates her with her Son who experienced death, but this detail is not part of the dogma.

The gospel of the solemnity includes Mary's great Magnificat (Luke 1: 46-55) which challenges many assumptions of her time and ours:

He that is mighty, has done great things to me; and holy is his name. His mercy is from generation unto generations, to them that fear him. He has showed might in his arm: he has scattered the proud in the conceit of their heart. He has put down the mighty from their seat and has exalted the low-ly. He has filled the hungry with good things; and the rich he has sent away empty.

We too should strive to rise above human biases and see more as God sees – the kingdom of God is not to be found among earthly kingdoms but yet it is present all around us and in us if we could only realise it. Those who looked with pity or contempt on the poor teenage girl who was pregnant did not realise that she was the mother of God.
