Month of the Holy Souls

During November each year we, the living faithful, unite our hearts with, and in a special way remember, all the faithful departed, whether they be in heaven or in purgatory. The month begins with the Solemnity of All Saints. On this day we honour all those canonised as saints and all other saints (the vast majority) who are not yet recognised by the world but who are known and embraced by God. When we are baptized, we are called to be saints. We are to be the Christian example for others to follow. Most of us do not become outstanding examples worthy of canonisation but you can probably think of someone who fits this description: *Someone whose life we can learn from showing us by example what God is truly like*. - **Pope Benedict XVI**On the 1st November, we honour ALL saints, some of them will have been

On All Souls' Day, 2nd November, the Church prays for all those in purgatory, people very much like us (and maybe better!). By praying for them, we can be inspired to lead better lives. On this day, and during the entire month of November, we can remember our departed sisters and brothers in various ways: by going to the cemetery where they are buried, obtaining indulgences for them, helping the poor and doing other good works performed with the inten-

tion of helping the faithful departed. Most powerfully, we can ask for Masses to be said on behalf of our dearly departed and, a work of mercy, for those who have no one left to pray for them.

Holy Water

We have holy water at the side entrance of the Church, if you would like to bring some home with you. Holy Water has been blessed by a priest and is called a sacramental as it is a visible sign that imparts invisible grace. It is extremely effective at protecting us from evil and temptation. Sprinkle yourself with it before leaving home in the morning and before you go to sleep.
