IRISH SAINT Part 2

Following her conversion experience in Spain, Clare Crockett returned to Ireland and her final year in school. She felt torn between her worldly life and the call she felt from God and what answering it would entail: Although I received this great grace, it is not that I immediately started doing penance and changing my life. Everything that someone says to Jesus when she has received a strong grace either in

a retreat, on a pilgrimage, at an encounter-we have to remember it and live it when we return to our daily lives, to our usual environment. She knew that she would give everything or nothing because that is what she always did, and she felt scared. However, within a year, realising that nothing less than God could satisfy her, she made her final decision. In 2001, at the age of 18, she left her family, boyfriend, and all she knew in Ireland to return to Spain and enter the convent where it all started. She didn't speak Spanish. She was entrusting her entire life to God. She took her final vows there in 2010.

She worked in Spain, USA, and Ecuador, doing pastoral care duties, hospital chaplaincy, teaching, and missionary outreach. She was known for her ability to be truly with people and was much loved by her pupils. She died in Ecuador in 2016 at the age of 33 when the building where she was teaching music collapsed during an earthquake. Her body was brought home to Derry. Clare's life was short but lived with great joy. She was completely in love with the Lord and transmitted this very naturally and with simplicity to everyone she met and in everything she did. She explained that every morning she gave the Lord a blank cheque and she would then do whatever He asked of her. This article cannot do justice to the beautiful and inspirational person Clare is. There is something that the Lord has taught me. The person who loses his life, and forgets oneself and dies to self is happy. And this is the truth. This is the truth.

Let us ask ourselves in the presence of the Lord whether, as bishops, priests, consecrated persons and laity in the service of the Kingdom of God, we cooperate with others. Whether we show ourselves welcoming, with concrete gestures, to those both near and far. Whether we make others feel a part of the community or keep them at a distance.

Our church will also be open until 6pm week days with the brighter evenings so please do drop in regularly to gladden the Lord's heart who is always so happy to see us and He always gives us a gift of peace in our busy lives.
